Stokesley Town Council carried out public consultation through our website and through our Newsletter which appears in the 'Market Place' magazine and is circulated to every household in Stokesley.

The consultation confirmed that the Public Toilets were identified as one of the top priorities along with improvements to the Levenside. New Christmas Lights were second and the installation of a CCTV camera in the North Road Play Park as third. The Public Toilet refurbishment project and phase 1 of the new lights Christmas Lights were completed in 2018/19 along with Bench repairs.

2019/20 saw the completion of the Christmas Lights Phase 2, 2 new benches on the West Green adjacent to the Cenotaph and the installation of the CCTV system in the North Road Play Park. The Town Council also decided to replace the litter bins in the Play Park which were beyond repair along with one on Ashwood Drive.

No CIL Funds were spent during 2020/21 due to the pandemic.

2021/22 - Due to the poor state of repair of some of the equipment in the U8s Play Park it was agreed to remove some of the old equipment and carry out routine repairs, this work was paid for out of the Town Council budget. It was agreed at the same time to install some new 'accessible equipment' in this area. The total cost for the purchase and installation of this new equipment was £10,933(excluding vat). The Town Council were awarded a £5,000 grant from the NYCC Locality Fund and the remaining £5,933 was paid for from CIL Funds.
